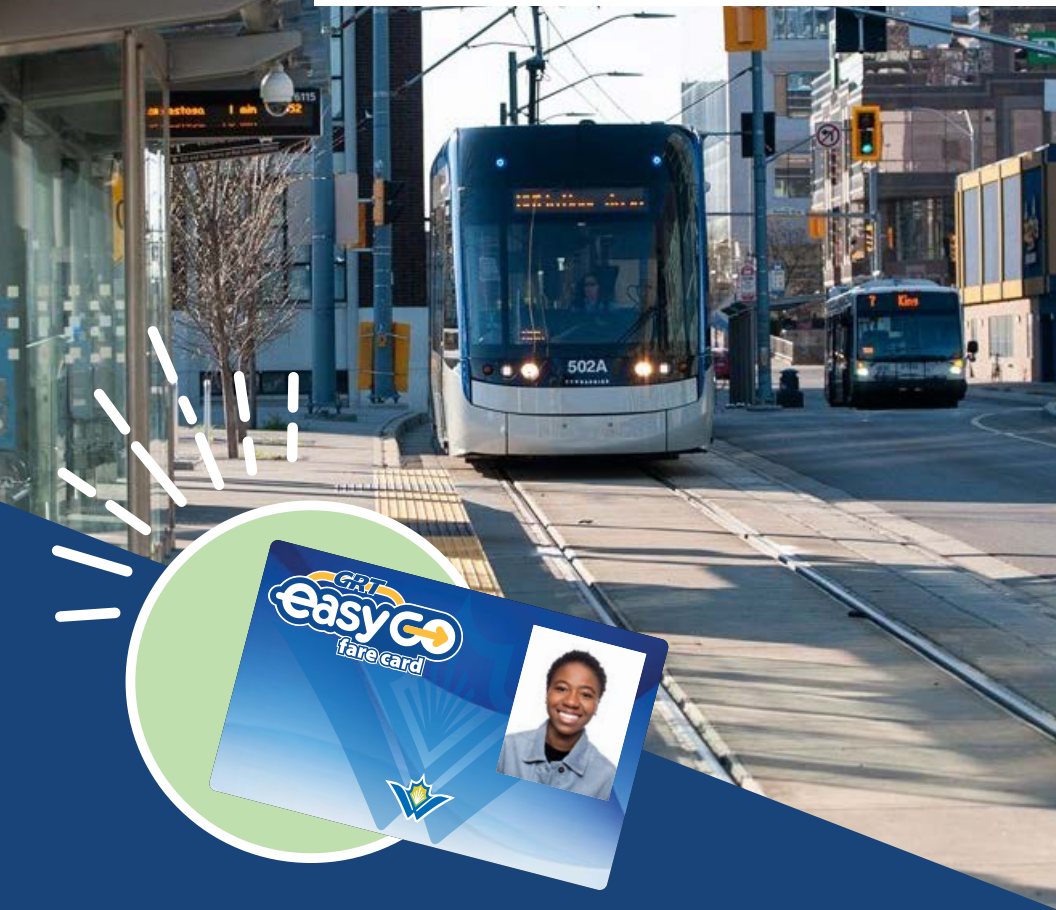


Affordable Transit Program (ATP)



Learn how to
save on GRT fares

If you are living with low income in Waterloo Region you may qualify for the Affordable Transit Program (ATP).

The ATP offers a discount on the price of GRT fares, visit grt.ca/fares for details.

Fare Product
Monthly pass
Stored value payment
MobilityPLUS ATP tickets (strip of 5)

Who can apply?

Anyone 18 or older can apply for the ATP. Eligibility for the program is based on the net income of your household (line 23600 from each members tax return), this includes your spouse/partner, and any dependents 18 or older in your household. If approved, all members of your household can receive the ATP discount, including those 17 or younger. For information on household size and income limits, please visit grt.ca/ATP.

Eligibility for the ATP is managed by Region of Waterloo's Department of Community Services.



If you're 17 years old or younger, and are financially independent, please contact your caseworker or Community Services for more information.

Full-time post-secondary students are not eligible for the Affordable Transit Program.

How do I apply?

- Online at grt.ca/ATP
- In person at one of the Community Services Welcome Centres, open Monday to Friday from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

What do I need to apply?

You will need to provide proof of address and your household income. You can do this online or in person at the Community Services Welcome Centres. For up to date information on what's needed to apply and accepted documents, please visit grt.ca/ATP.

What documents are accepted?

Proof of Address (one of the following)

- Valid driver's licence
- Ontario photo ID card
- Government issued mail
- Current utility bill
- Rent receipt or lease
- Mortgage document

Proof of Income

(one of the following for every person in your household 18 or older).

- Canada Revenue Agency Notice of Assessment
- Letter from Registered Social Worker
- CRA Proof of income statement (Option C)

If you are new to Canada in the current calendar year, you can submit one of the following:

- PR or citizenship card
- Refugee protection document
- Verification of claim
- Work permit
- Confirmation of permanent residence

If you are a former student:

If you were a student in the last calendar year, you will need to provide proof of completion/graduation documents.

What if I already receive social assistance?

Ontario Works and Ontario Disability Support Program clients will be asked for:

- Date of Birth
- SAMS Member ID or Social Insurance Number

How do I know if I've been approved?

You will be notified by email, text or phone within approximately seven days of your application.

Eligibility lasts for one year. Applicants should re-apply 30 days before their card expires to remain in the program.
